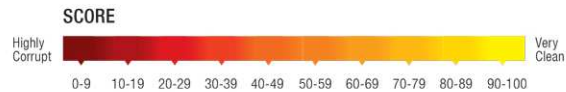
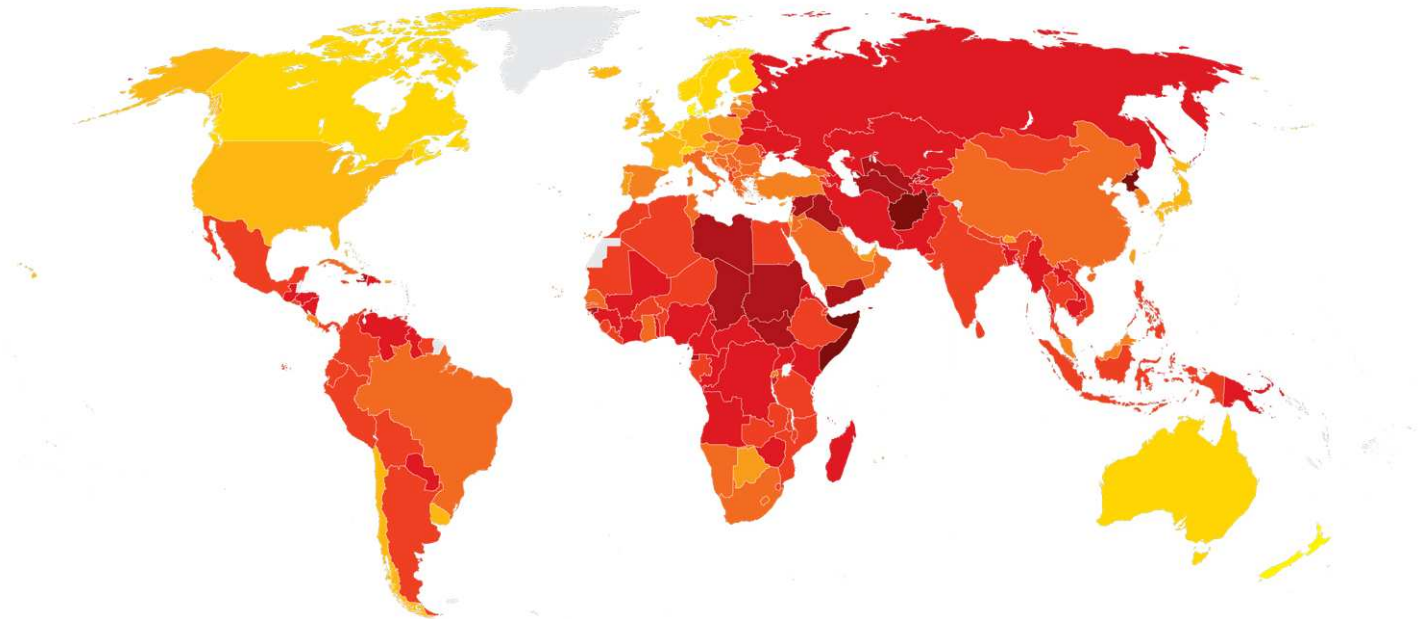


# Global Corruption (TI, 2013)

# *Corruption across the World*

- Still very high perceptions of corruption across Africa, Asia, Russia and most of South America
- Continuing high attention from public, press, politicians
- Better efforts to identify sources of funds – G20 Summit
- Recognition that top-down is not enough
- Are rich countries are doing enough to outlaw bribes?
- Western banking corruption
- Increasing gap between rich and poor worldwide – globalised elite – money perverting democracy
- Cynical use of the fight against corruption
- Task as great as ever

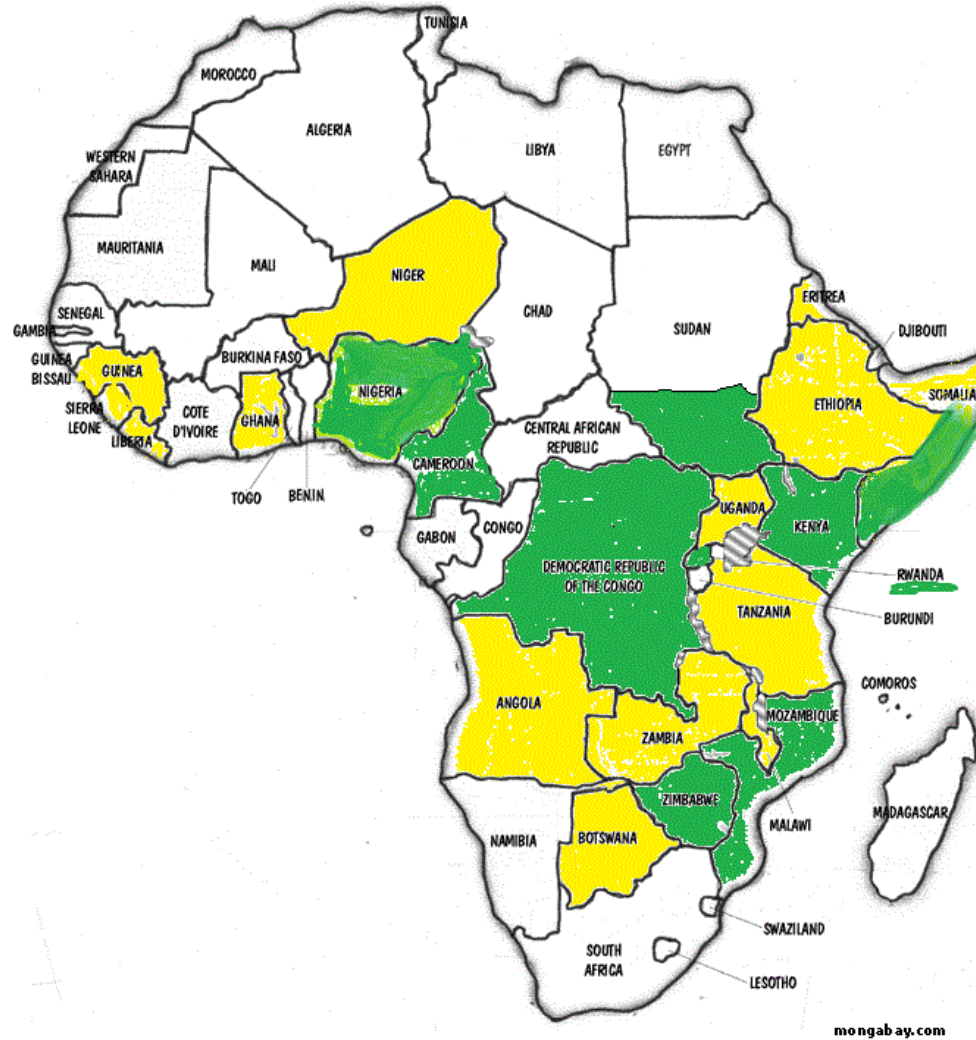


# *IGI Highlights*

- Big growth in activity in Rwanda + Somalia
- Kenya: network of CTAs developing and more active
- Cameroon: widening range of activities, particularly in schools and sector construction – new funder
- DRC, Rwanda, Somalia: high profile publicity and education in issues of corruption
- Zimbabwe re-constituted
- Better reporting of the work of FITs
- UK continues to provide small-scale support funding and central services
- Appeals in UK – but response limited
