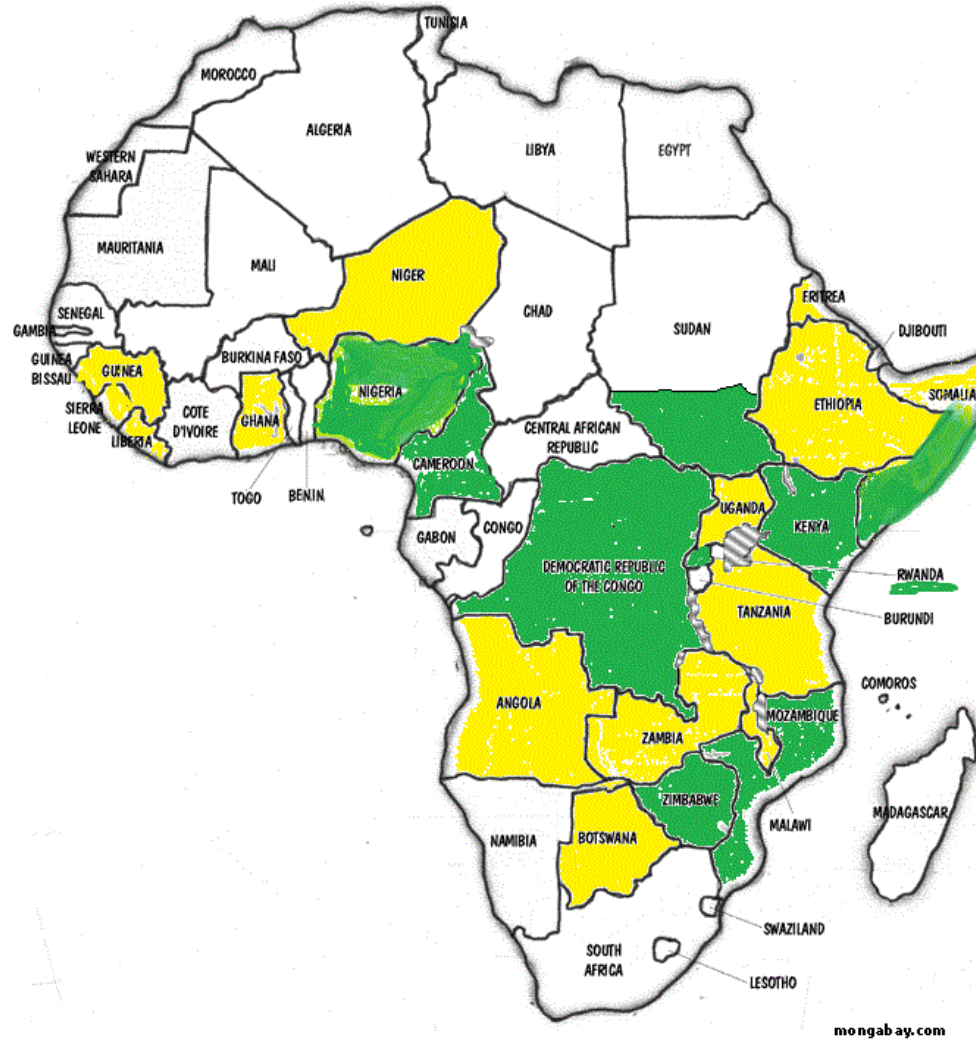


IGI Highlights

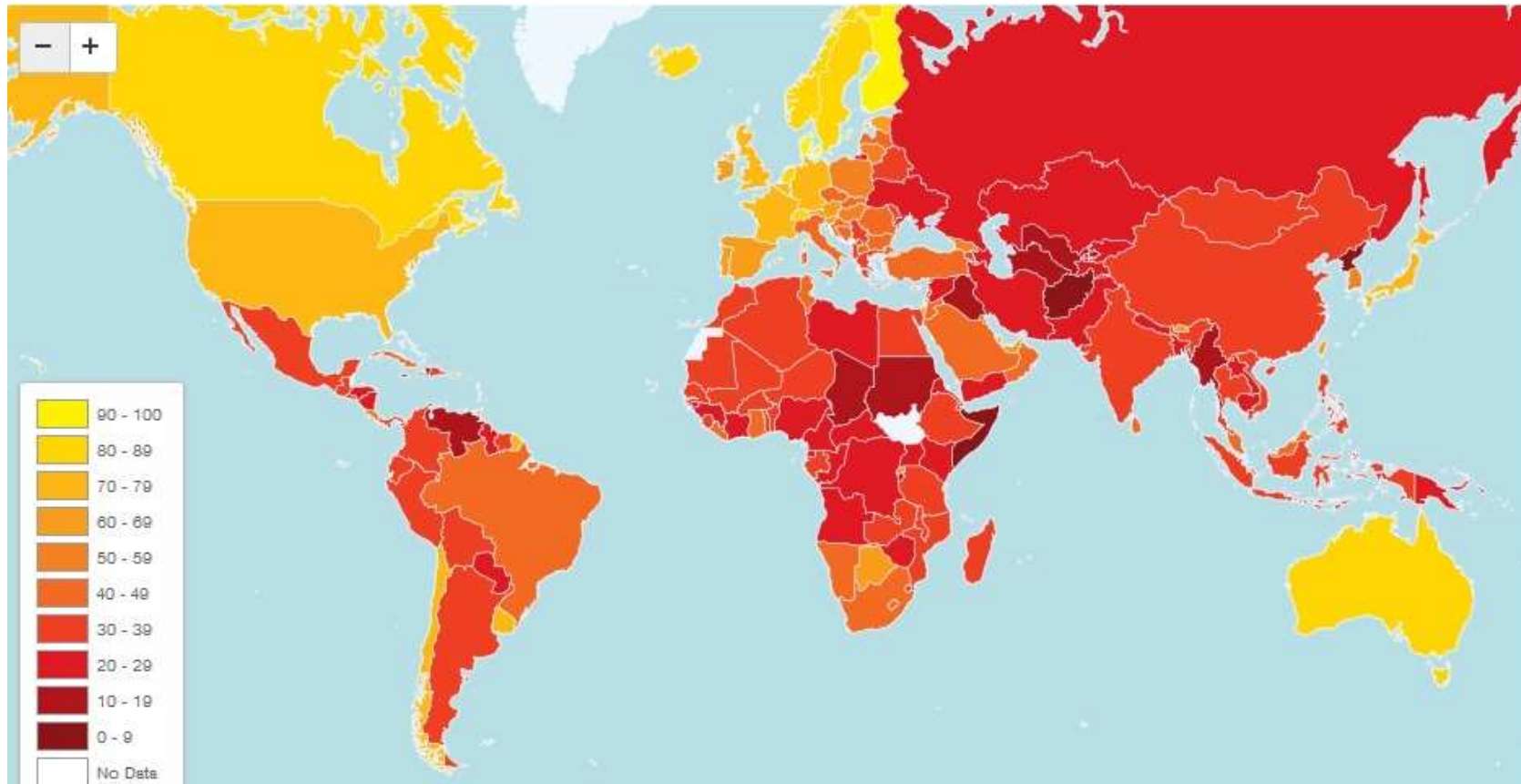
- Nigeria: Integrity 'ododo' Development Initiative
- Somalia: launch and baseline report
- Kenya, Cameroon, DRC – continuing commitment
- Rwanda – developing a programme
- Disappointments: South Sudan and Mozambique
- Formal membership growth 5%
- Moved slowly in UK
 - Personnel issues
 - Continued support for web communications, facebook, newsletters, AGM
 - Small-scale support for work in Cameroon, DRC, Kenya
 - Managed to support costs of several FITs

Corruption across the World

- TI map little changed - Germany, Japan slightly darker
- Still high perceptions of corruption across Africa, Asia, Russia and most of South America
- Task as great as ever
- Is the talk leading to action?
 - E.g. UK Bribery Act, 3 convictions in two years
 - Uhuru Kenyatta wanting to hear from whistle-blowers
- Take courage from the progress of the last 20 years – no longer simply accepted /ignored
- Becoming more sophisticated:
 - Protecting whistle-blowers,
 - Identifying financial flows - transparency



A few positive developments

- Sense a growing public intolerance of corruption
- Continued public protest – e.g. in Turkey, Brazil
- Positive talk and public trials of high officials in China
- Continuing high profile for major corruption cases in Press – e.g. British company that provided election materials in Kenya
- More acceptance of need for transparency of ownership of organisations – where is the money going?
- Well-run elections in Kenya



IGI Goals

- Develop and mobilise more support in UK
- Identify joint projects to build on IGI experience, either in higher education sector or with CTAs
- Projects in Nigeria, Somalia and Rwanda
